

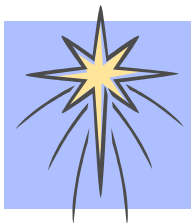

LL Advent Offering & Community Event

LOVELY LANE'S ADVENT OFFERING FOR 2010

This year's recipients of Advent offering are:

Biking for Kids in India: Lauren Brown stopped at Lovely Lane this summer as part of his cross-country bicycle trip to raise money for poor Indian children so they can attend Methodist schools. There are 7 Methodist schools affiliated with the Hyderabad Conference of the Methodist Church in India; each has a boys and girls hostel affiliated with it. Due to the relative poverty of the India Conference, many of these schools are facing severe financial challenges and many poor children in remote villages aren't getting the opportunity of an education in a Methodist school.

Helping Hands Ministry: An affiliate of the Ecumenical Community Center here in Cedar Rapids, Helping Hands provides emergency material assistance with rent and utilities, referrals to local service agencies, and supportive ministry to persons in emergency need. They collaborate with faith communities in Linn County (including Lovely Lane). They serve anyone in Linn County who is in need of emergency help.

Network of Faith: An affiliate of the Inter-religious Council, Network of Faith is a citywide interfaith collaborative effort to supply local homeless shelters with cleaning and hygiene products. Through the program, a variety of faith groups in the community commit to supplying four local emergency homeless shelters with hygiene supplies on a predetermined schedule to ensure that all shelters have their needs met throughout the year. Lovely Lane has committed to supply two shelters for the quarter from January through March 2011.

Southern Poverty Law Center: The Southern Poverty Law Center is a nonprofit civil rights organization, based in Montgomery, Alabama, dedicated to fighting hate and bigotry, and to seeking justice for the most vulnerable members of society. Founded by civil rights lawyers Morris Dees and Joseph Levin Jr. in 1971, the SPLC is internationally known for tracking and exposing the activities of hate groups. The "Teaching Tolerance" program produces and distributes – free of charge – documentary films, books, lesson plans and other materials that promote tolerance and respect in our nation's schools.

"GOD SIGHTINGS"

Following is a condensed article by Bob Whitten, award-winning columnist for the Clinton Herald Newspaper, given to Pastor Paul by member Leonard Warner. It's on the same subject—only changes God "sightings" to "moments."

'God' moments provide inspiration

A few things happened to me this week that strengthened my faith. I would like to share [one] with you today.

This week I have been down, feeling sorry for myself more than anything. God puts things in front of us just when we need them. I can prove it.

I was taking a break from work. I was boo-hooing about the long day I had put in, convincing myself what a rough life I had. Some days are easy for me, but lately I have had quite a string of long, stressful days. Just as I was heading off the deep end, emotionally the light turned red and a man with a cane slowly started to walk across in front of my truck. He looked to be in his 30s, much younger than me.

He had a physical disability that kept him from walking the way I do. His muscles tensed up and jerked uncontrollably as he attempted to get across the street before the light changed.

He failed, but I waited for him. He turned as he stepped on the curb, and he smiled and waved at me. I looked in his eyes, and he looked happy. For one moment he looked right at me and I felt his sense of accomplishment, his pride. It took me back. Here I am in my truck, whining about my life, and this guy is smiling because he made it across the street.

He inspired me.

The other day a friend of mine was talking of "God" moments, and my ears perked up.

"Maybe you're driving down the road, and you catch a glimpse of a hawk sitting on a fence post," she said. "Just a moment, too quick to show anyone, gone in a second, but sharp in your image."

She continued, "This is a moment God gave to me, just me."

Since that day I have noticed many of these "God" moments. Over and over again they happen to me. Over and over again God gives me inspiration through these moments. For too long I have taken these moments for granted. I will try harder to appreciate these moments and the gifts God has given me.

Life is just too short to get caught up in the little, petty things that may be bringing us down. Something much bigger is happening all around us. I, for one, am going to stay awake for my moments. Furthermore, I will try to be a part of those moments, helping God wherever and whenever He needs me. I do believe in my heart, that is why I am still on this earth, to help others see the good things in life.

I will always be looking for those "God" moments.
